Track Market, introweek events, UCU NEXT, MTSE, Lustrum



made a year plan and biyearly reflection reports, organised the student-staff events, and worked on the UU Teacher of the Year submission.

#### WHAT HAVE WE LEARNED THIS YEAR?

- The behind the scenes of UCU; Institutional expertise
- Communication in a professional environment.
- How to wear different "hats"
- Team work and time management
- Addressing conflicts and concerns in a critical and solution-focused manner
- How to balance and advocate for student needs in an efficient, proactive manner.



### **AROUND 20 HOURS PER WEEK**

This time is spent on things like...

- 2 board meetings per week; 4 hours in total
- UCUC, BoS, MT meetings
- Meetings of other committees and working groups in the college
- Weekly office hours
- Meetings with cluster chairs, fellows, track representatives, students
- Meetings with the other student boards and groups on campus, other UU faculties and external parties
- Daily to-do's: sending out emails, preparing meetings, reading documents
- Organizing events, focus groups, projects Conducting surveys, writing reports

### MADE POSSIBLE BY: COURSE REDUCTION

Reduction of (up to) 2 courses per semester

Usually compensated by taking a 7th semester (but this may not always be necessary if you have a large previous credit surplus)

Financial compensation which also covers your 7th semester tuition (for EEA students)



# FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

### COSTS

- Cost of studying & living at UCU for an extra semester
  - Can be less if you go on exchange or live off campus!

## **COMPENSATION**

- Board year grant to compensate the work you do, this covers for the tuition
  - fees of your 7th semester
    - For EEA students: full coverage
      - of tuition fees + a little more
    - For non-EEA students: partly
      - coverage of tuition fees
